Gerunds and infinitives

{ Gerunds }

- V → Noun
- Continuous or progressive
- prep + V
- after specific verbs (p.M7)

{ Infinitives }

- after auxiliaries + modal
- after adjectives
- to → purpose (proposit., per)
- after some specific verbs (p.M7)

① - Like

G → when you enjoy doing sth. Ex: I like teaching English

I → personal preferences. Ex: I like to dress black clothes

② - Remember

G → takes place in the PAST. Ex: I remember kissing her on the bridge

I → takes place in the FUTURE. Ex: Please remember to take the rubbish out.

③ - Stop

G → interrupt sth. Ex: He stopped running as he felt tired.

I → interrupt sth in order to do sth else. Ex: He stopped running to drink water

④ - Forget

G → PAST. Ex: I will never forget meeting her

I → FUTURE. Ex: Don't forget to call your mom

⑤ - Try

G → power (sense effort) Ex: I tried swimming but I didn't like.

I → intention (amb effort). Ex: I tried to run faster but I couldn't.

⑥ - Regret (lamentar-se)

G → PAST. Ex: I regret not having studied for the exam

I → FUTURE. Ex: I regret to tell you that the final exam is going to be tough
