Ex: Recio is so clever that all Yaniras love him

such + NP that

→ Recio is such a clever guy that ↴

→ The weather was terrible. However they enjoyed their holidays.

Despite of the bad weather they enjoyed their holidays.

→ They failed because they didn't study (of)

They failed because of the lack of study.

→ He stopped because he wanted to avoid hitting the dog (as)

He stopped so as not to hit the dog

→ The match won't be cancelled even if it rains (of)

The match won't be cancelled // because of // the rain  
in spite of

→ Despite the late train, they arrived in time

Although the train was late they arrived in time

→ He studies so that he can pass (so)

He studies so as not to fail

→ Tom hates the cold but he goes skiing anyway

In spite of hating the cold he goes skiing anyway

In spite of the fact Tom hates the cold he goes skiing anyway
