1. <u>CONDITIONAL (zero, first, second and third conditionals)</u> Zero (general truth)

- If you heat water, it boils (If + present simple, present simple)
- If you don't eat, you die

You can swap the phrases

First (possible future happening)

- If you don't study, you will fail (If + present simple, will + infinitive)
- If it doesn't rain, I'll go

Second (imaginary situation)

• If I won the lottery, I would buy a house (If + past simple, would/could + infinitive)

Third (what could have happened in the past ureal)

- If I had studied harder, I would have had a better mark (If + past perfect, would/ could + have + past perfect)
- 2. IF O<mark>NLY/ WI</mark>SH

<u>I wish/ if only + past simple</u> to talk about imaginary situations in the present. Wishes for things to be different in the present:

- I wish/ if only I was taller
- I wish/ if only I was on the beach right now

<u>I wish/ if only + past perfect</u> to talk about past situations that we would have liked to be different. Regrets.

- I wish/ if only I had studied harder for...
- I wish/ if only I hadn't spent my money last weekend.

<u>I wish/ if only + would/ wouldn't + infinitive</u> to talk about somebody's habitual behavior that we want to criticize and change. (Different subject)

- I wish/ if only my sister wouldn't take my outfits
- My dad smokes. I wish/ if only he wouldn't do it.

3. UNLESS, AS LONG AS, PROVIDED/PROVIDING (THAT) IN CASE

Unless: a n<mark>o ser que</mark>

• We won't be able to swim unless the swimming pool is open.

As long as/ provided/ providing: sempre que/ només si

• We'll be able to swim as long as/ provided the swimming pool is open. In case: en cas que/ per si de cas

• We'll take our swimming costumes in case the swimming pool is open.
